The book of Acts, sometimes called the fifth Gospel, is a continuation of the four Gospels. Matthew concludes with the Resurrection, Mark with the Ascension, Luke with the promise of the Holy Spirit, and John with the promise of the Second Coming—all of these funnel down into the first chapter of Acts. And as all four do, Acts confirms the great missionary call, "Take this good news to the world!"

Acts builds a bridge between the Gospels and the Epistles. Just imagine, Dr. Luke, the author of Acts, likely got together with Peter and Paul many times and shared many wonderful talks about how God was at work in their separate mission fields. Read Acts and their letters together and you get a picture of early church history, along with the personal relationships and struggles that each of the letters address

One verse summarizes Acts, a promise from Jesus Himself as He returns to heaven: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Acts records tremendous growth of the church in those first generations. By the end of the first century alone, millions followed the Lord Jesus Christ. Dr. Luke mentions 110 people by name, in addition to multitudes and crowds.

What was it that got everyone's attention? Jesus' resurrection—the center of all gospel preaching. In the early church the resurrection of Jesus Christ was the heart of the message, and no sermon was preached without it. In the early church, "He is risen!" was proclaimed everywhere; every day was a day to proclaim the Resurrection, not just on Easter.

But the book isn't complete! The narrative of the church is a continuing story. Perhaps Dr. Luke is today in glory writing the next chapters?! Perhaps he is recording what we do for Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. Although the Lord left the earth, He only has just moved His headquarters to the right hand of the Father. Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit (John 1:33; 7:37-39; 14:16-17; 20:22; and Acts 1:8) to be the great power of this age and He did. Right now His Spirit lives in us, His believers.

Our commission now is to be His witness. We should make Him the center of attraction. This directive is not only to the church as a body but it is also a very personal command to each believer—personally, privately. Our business is to get the Word of God out to the world. The Lord wants people to be saved. This is our part in His great commission.

In order to get this gospel out, we need power. Jesus promises to be with us through His Spirit and move through us personally, and through His church and through every ministry. Our only choice is whether we permit Him to be powerful.

Jesus said we are to take our testimony, our witness of Him, to the end of the earth. This global reach is His idea. What are you doing to take Jesus Christ to the world?

In order to "take the whole Word to the whole world," the book of Acts teaches us that we need God's power. God promises to be with us through His Spirit and move through us personally, through His church, and through every ministry. Dr. McGee reminds us "our only choice is whether we permit Him to be powerful."

It's hard to believe it's been 12 years since the world's attention turned to the island nation of Haiti following the devastating 7.0 magnitude temblor that struck on the afternoon of January 12, 2010 and killed over 200,000 people. It was just one more disaster in a country that has suffered from decades of political, economic, and social setbacks and inequalities. Insecurity due to gang fights makes life here impossible.

Haiti needs Jesus.

"The most important objective in bringing Thru the Bible to Haiti is to hold out hope in the midst of despair and abandonment," says Annabel Torrealba, our TWR regional partner. "Thru the Bible's broadcasts on 4VEH are bringing life to the lost and spiritual strength to the believers. Certainly, in the country 40% of the population speaks French, but the heart language of the people is Creole, 99.9% of the inhabitants speak Creole, **During difficult** times, hearing hope in the language of your heart is key, it brings comfort and peace."

BECAUSE HE LOVED US

The romance of Ruth and Boaz is one of the most beautiful stories in the Bible.

It's a real romance—complete with an honorable warrior who fights for the hand of a beautiful woman from Moab who has humbled herself to care for her poverty-stricken mother-in-law. Boaz moves heaven and earth to get the right to marry Ruth—and in their story we see a picture of Jesus' love for us and the provision He makes as our Kinsman—Redeemer.

That kinsman—redeemer (in Hebrew, *goel***) is a picture of the Lord Jesus Christ.** He is our Kinsman—Redeemer who pays a price so that the one who is redeemed may get off scot free. The only biblical example of a kinsman—redeemer is Boaz. **It reveals the love side of redemption.** Boaz doesn't have to act in that capacity; there was another who was actually a nearer relative to Ruth than Boaz, but he didn't care about her. But Boaz loved her. I think he looked like a dying calf in a thunderstorm. That made all the difference.

Now God didn't have to redeem us. We were lost sinners. If He did not redeem us, He could still be a just and holy God. But He loved us. You see, salvation by redemption is a love story. And now we have it told here in simple language illustrated by this little foreign girl from Moab and Boaz in the land of Israel.

Jamal's story came to us via our TTB-Arabic audio ministry streamed on twr's Arabic digital platforms:

"I'm a carpenter and one day while I was repairing furniture in someone's home, I came across a small book titled 'Luke.' I asked the person who had recruited me for the job about it and he answered carelessly that 'some infidels gave it to me while I was traveling back home.'

"Something triggered in my heart, but I didn't give it much thought. A week later while I was sitting and browsing through my phone. I was strangely reminded of the book that I saw in that house. So I started browsing the internet for the Bible and Christianity. I then came across a radio stream called 'TWR Arabic' and started listening. A program called

'Thru the Bible' caught my ears, and so I started focusing on it. Because it was mentioning some unique teachings on a religion I knew little about, I noted the time and day in order to listen again. After two months of regular listening, I decided to call the number that is mentioned at the end of the program.



"I called after each episode to ask about the Bible teaching and about Jesus Christ. Of course, at the beginning I mentioned what I had been taught through my inherited religion, that the Bible is corrupt and was misinterpreted. I asked them to explain why they call it the Word of God.

"Because of your thorough explanation through the program, your sincere follow up, your patience with my questions and doubts, along with what God is doing in my heart. I feel and believe there is no more room for doubt and ill-faith in Jesus I want to declare that Jesus is Lord and I want to ask Him to cleanse me from my bad history full of sins. And if I ever doubted Jesus in the past. I regret that from the bottom of my heart. I want to follow Christ and see Him work in my life!"
